EPA BRIEFING:

Keith Glenn, EPA Representative, presented a brief summary of information concerning the issue on Osborne Court as follows:

- Anticipate testing to be completed by the end of the summer.
- Biggest concern is high concentration of lead
- Evaluate the entire property
- Testing within 2 feet of the surface
- Determine the source of the issue
- Keith Glenn's position is that EPA will investigate the contamination, most importantly the lead contamination. If EPA determines that the lead was caused by JCP&L, then EPA will pursue JCP&L to

remediate. If EPA determines that JCP&L was not the cause of the lead then EPA will try to find funding so that the lead can be remediated.

• Glenn pointed out that there was no guarantee that funding would be available.

RENTAL ASSISTANCE DEMONSTRATION (RAD) SUMMARY STATUS:

The E.D. reported that the deadline for submitting required documentation for RAD has been extended until June 2020 because of the environmental issues.

ENVIRONMENTAL HISTORY:

On January 9, 2019 a brainstorming session was held with representatives of the City, CMHA, the Solicitors and the RAD Consultant. It was agreed the LSRP would submit a Proposal for Preparation of Preliminary Cost Estimate to for Osborne Court. Mott MacDonald submitted that proposal on January 16, 2020, to the E.D.

On January 29, 2020 Christopher Venezia, Mott MacDonald, submitted a Proposal for Preparation of Preliminary Cost Estimate Osborne Court Housing Complex for an estimated fee of \$11,700.00. On January 29, 2020 JCP&L agreed to fully fund the scope of work estimated completion date February 24, 2020.

NON-PROFIT:

Chairperson Dr. Keith Lafferty reported that the annual fundraiser at the Cape May Brewery has been rescheduled for September.

CMC is planning a number of summer activities such as: End of School Celebration, Tutoring, Sailing, Golfing and Horseback riding.

Additionally, CMC will purchase keyboards/covers for the T-Mobile tablets.

HUD 5-YEAR CMHA PLAN:

The Authority is currently working on preparing the 5-Year Plan for submission to HUD. The Authority received an extension until December 31st for submission.
